



Before the war, fruit trees and agricultural products were abundant in Angola. After 30 years of civil war, agricultural production has been destroyed.

The government of Angola has granted the United Methodist Church land on which to plant avocado, mango, banana and other food producing plants – as a way of supplying food and financial assistance to the church's outreach ministry to the homeless children.

Volunteers from California-Nevada have lent a hand planting trees on this land but so much more needs to be done. The people of Angola can plant the crops. But they do not have the financial resources to build the needed irrigation system, or to buy the plants. Your donation will go to the purchase of a tree, and toward the funds needed to irrigate the land.
