GENERAL CHURCH MISSION & SUPPORT

United Methodist Churches are connected to each other and the world through a common commitment to share our resources as faithful stewards of God's gifts. The UMC apportions each conference for funds to provide those resources and support mission around the world. This comes to us through the **General Church Mission & Support** apportionment.

The General Church Mission & Support apportionments are at the core of how we as United Methodists function as the church. These items include the World Service Fund, which is the heart of our denomination-wide global presence, underwriting Christian mission and ministry around the world. Through the World Service Fund, the General Board of Global Ministries enables us to support 2,000 permanent missionaries in ministry here and around the globe. That includes more than 60 missionaries in New Mission Initiatives in 11 world regions - from Latvia and Cameroon to Senegal and Lithuania. There are also missionaries here in the U.S., from those serving with a two-year commitment as US-2s to dedicated United Methodist Volunteers in Mission.

The General Church Mission & Support includes the Black College Fund, supporting 11 historically African-American United Methodist-related institutions of higher education. These colleges attract students from diverse social, economic and educational backgrounds, helping students strive for academic excellence based on the Christian perspective of community service and social responsibility. Africa University is also included here. Africa University is the only United Methodist degree-granting university on the continent of Africa and the first private university in Zimbabwe.

These apportionment items also provide funds for ministerial education and the episcopal leadership of our denomination. The work of our General and Jurisdictional conferences, as well as other general church administration, also receive assistance.
